Brief Profile of Prof. Navjivan Rastogi



Navjivan Rastogi, besides being a pupil in the direct lineage of K.C.Pandey, is privileged to have been a colleague of his master and mentor for six years with whom he (jointly) edited an anonymous sub-commentary on Abhinavagupta's ä÷vara-pratyabhij¤à-vimar÷inã (unpublished).

Formerly Honorary Director of the Abhinavagupta Institute of Aesthetics and øaiva Philosophy, founded by his teacher K.C. Pandey, he retired from active service as the chairperson of the Department of Sanskrit, Pali, and Pràkçta languages, University of Lucknow.

Navjivan Rastogi came to prominence with the publication of his Krama Tantricism of Kashmir, vol. 1.

His other major works for which he is known are: An Introduction to the Tantràloka: A Study in Structure and Ka÷mãra øivàdvayavàda kã Måla Avadhàraõàyeï (in Hindi, "Key Concepts of the øaiva Monism of Kashmir").

He has also edited the Tantràloka with the Viveka of Jayaratha, in eight volumes jointly with R.C. Dwivedi. Among his most recent works the Abhinavagupta kà Tantràgamãya Dar÷ana (in Hindi, "The Tantràgamic Philosophy of Abhinavagupta") has been highly acclaimed by the scholars followed by Abhinavà: Perspectives on Abhinavagupta edited jointly with Dr. Meera Rastogi.

His monograph Kà÷mãra øivàdvayavàda me§ Pramàõa-cintana, published in 2013, is an original contribution to Kashmir øaiva epistemology. The Word Index of the Tantràloka, a sort of supplementary addendum to his Introduction to the Tantràloka, is to be released in one of these days.

His major current engagements are English translation of the øivadçùñi of Somànanda under the translation project of ICPR and co-editing of the volume on Kashmir øaivism of the Encyclopaedia of Indian Philosophies with Karl H. Potter, University of Washington, Seattle.
